Getting there

Strathclyde Country Park is accessible by public transport and a bus stop is situated at the Motherwell entrance to the park. If making your way by train please alight at either Motherwell or Airbles Road stations from where you can either walk, take a bus or taxi to the park. It is advised that timetable directions be sought before travelling. For patrons who are travelling to the park by car there are numerous car parks within the park with in excess of 3,000 spaces available.

Where to park

All competitors and spectators cars must be parked in Car Parks 3 and 4 if you are wanting to park close to the Watersport Centre. There will be no car parking allowed in Car Parks 1 or 2 as these are being used for racking and trailers.

How the competition works

Challenge Trophies, presented by the countries shown below, will be awarded to the teams scoring the highest total in each relevant match. In the case of a tie, the match will be awarded to the country scoring the highest number of 1st places.

Points are scored as follows

- 4 boat events: 4, 3, 2, 1
- 3 boat events: 3, 2, 1
- 2 boat events: 3, 2
- 1 boat entered: 3 (no medal)

No points are scored by a crew that is disqualified or that fails to complete the course by reason of their own accident. Where there is a dead-heat, crews will share the points for the places involved (e.g. equal 1st means 3.5 points each).

There will also be a results board in the Spectators Marquee Results. I am also pleased to report that subject to there being a strong enough Internet connection that it is intended to stream via YouTube, some of the finishes of the races and medal ceremonies.

Medal Ceremonies

Ceremonies will take place for the winning crew only, and will take place on the water next to the presentation pontoon. Winning crews will cross the line, and turn under the bridge and make their way to the presentation pontoon next to the finish tower to have their medal ceremony.

Food and Drink

Volunteers from Strathclyde Park Rowing Club will be providing hot and cold drinks, biscuits and cakes in the Spectators Marquee that is situated in front of the presentation pontoons.

The Waterfront Cafe at the park is situated on the first floor of our Watersports Centre overlooking Strathclyde Loch. They provide a range of hot and cold food, and will be opening at 08:30 on the day of the competition.

Souvenir Programme and T-Shirts

A limited number of Souvenir Programmes costing £2 and T-Shirts costing £12 will be available to purchase in the Spectators Marquee

Medical Facilities

All accidents and emergencies must be reported to the Event Rowing Safety Adviser or the nearest Official as soon as possible. An ambulance manned by a paramedic and technician will be based in Car Park 2 and two first aiders will be based next to the Spectators Marquee.
